Please keep Cora and Chris in your thoughts and prayers! Roxie Barwick



LEGISLATION: On February 15, 2014, The President signed into law: S. 25, which extends for an additional fiscal year the current-law sequestration of certain Federal direct spending; repeals a current-law reduction in annual cost-of-living adjustments to military pensions for current military members and retirees; and establishes a \$2.3 billion transitional fund for Medicare payments for physicians services in 2017; and

S. 540, the "Temporary Debt Limit Extension Act," which temporarily suspends the public debt limit until March 15, 2015

EANGUS - CALL TO ACTION - 14-01

The Call 14-01: Back the Hunter/Walz Letter. Answer the call: http://www.capwiz.com/eangus/issues/alert/?alertid=63064171&type=CO

Introduction: The Department of the Defense is planning to significantly change the Army's force structure, including the removal of significant aviation assets from the Army National Guard. The Issue: The Army is threatening the same type of arbitrary cuts as the U.S. Air Force tried in 2012 with the Air National Guard.

Background: EANGUS is voicing opposition to this, and Congress is making a number of moves to counter these cuts. The first was a letter sent by U.S. Representatives Duncan Hounter (R-CA) and Tim Walz (D-MN) to the U.S. Army Chief of Staff and the Chief of the National Guard Bureau on January 16th.

The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States stands 100% in agreement with U.S. Representatives Duncan Hunter (R-CA) and Tim Walz (D-MN) with regard to their letter to General Raymond Odierno and Gen Frank Grass, dated January 16. We encourage every EANGUS member to respond to this Call to Action and send an instant letter of support to your U.S. Senators and U.S. Representative, alerting them to this issue and asking them to stand with EANGUS and U.S. Representatives Hunter and Walz. Duncan Hunter continues to serve as a U.S. Marine Corps Reserve officer. Tim Walz is a retired Command Sergeant Major from the Army National Guard. Together, they are the Co-Chairs of the House Guard & Reserve Caucus.

We are writing in response to recent statements made at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., regarding capabilities provided by the Reserve components.

We all share a strong commitment to the men and women in the Active and Reserve components; however, it remains our belief that we must accurately characterize the critical capability that the Army Guard and Reserve forces bring to the global defense mission

As the Army completes its force structure review, it is extremely important to note that final troops levels will be decided by Congress, and any proposal by the Army should be reviewed thoroughly to ensure that it does not in any awy disparage or diminish the capabilities of one component over the other. We're not advocating for the Reserve component to take over the Active; however, there are certain truths in capabilities provided and costs saved with the

For instance, it is extremely disingenuous to say that Guard and Reserve units only train For instance, it is extremely singlemous to say that clearly an an esserve units only tail for 39 days out of the year while the Active component trains full-time. From our own person experiences, we know for a fact that while 39 days may be the minimum that individuals will train, there are significant other training activities that take place that put the total number of training days upwards of 90 to 100 days in some cases. Conversely, we know that Active components are not training full-time all year round, but actually train closer to 200 days or so year.

In fact, when also looking at the cost savings versus capability, studies show that the Army's annual cost to maintain readiness for an Active component infantry brigade combat team in dwell time is \$277 million. The cost to prepare this unit for deployment is \$8 million for a total cost of \$285 million. Meanwhile, the annual cost to maintain readiness for a National Guard infantry brigade combat team is \$66 million. The cost to prepare this unit to deploy is \$97 million, for a total cost of \$163 million. The total cost to maintain one Active component infantry brigade combat team is about twice that of the reserve component.

Again, this is not to advocate one component over the other, but it is important for the services and Congress to have an open and honest dialogue on the force structure of the Armed Forces. It is irresponsible to suggest that the Army National Quard and Reserve forces are not interchangeable and less capable to accomplish our national security objectives abroad.

As we continue this conversation heading into the fiscal year 2015 debate, we look forward to addressing these important matters with you.

EANGUS - CALL TO ACTION - 14-02

Introduction: The Department of the Defense is planning to significantly change the Army's force structure. These changes have the potentially to negatively impact the National Guard.

The Issue: These cuts would force an additional reduction of National Guard members below pre-9/11 numbers as well as eliminate all Apaches from the Army National Guard.

Background: The Fiscal Year 2015 Army budget proposal will be sent to Congress in the near future. The proposed budget should ensure the force structure and proposed end strength of Army National Guard maintains it as operational reserve.

The final troop levels of this proposal will be decided by Congress, not the Department of Defense. Over the past decade, Congress and the Department of Defense have made significant monetary investments into the Army National Guard. To allow these investments to be wasted would be fiscally irresponsible and negatively impact 50 states, three territories and the District of Columbia.

The National Guard is tasked with two very distinct missions. The first is to act as a reserve component to the active forces during a time of war. The second mission is to homeland response during domestic emergencies. It is imperative that both of these missions are taken into account during any revised force structure planning.

Recently, Representatives Joe Wilson (R-SC), Nick Rahall (D-WV), Vicky Hartzler (R-MO), and Candice Miller (R-MI) introduced H.R. 3930, a bill that would establish a National Commission on the Structure of the Army. This legislation will create a National Commission on the Structure of the Army and prohibit the Army from using FY15 funds to divest, retire, or transfer any aircraft out of the Army National Guard. Additionally, it will prohibit the Army from using FY15 funds to reduce personnel below the authorized end strength levels of 350,000 for the Army National Guard.

EANGUS Announces Congressional Award Recipients

2014 EAGLE & MILITIA AWARDS FOR THE U.S. SENATE

WASHINGTON D.C. (Jan. 17, 2014) – The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) is pleased to announce that U.S. Senators John Boozman (R-AR) and Mark Pryor (D-AR) have been selected to receive the 2014 G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Eagle Award. The award is given to members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives who have contributed outstanding and exceptional service to the National Guard.

As members of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee in 2013, Senators Boozman and Pryor introduced S-629, the Honor America's Guard-Reserve Retirees Act, which gives National Guard and Reserve Retirees with 20+ years of service the honor of being called a veteran. Historically, National Guard and Reserve members have not been recognized as veterans if they did not serve 180 days or more on federal active duty, even if they served 20-30 years or more.

EANGUS President John Helbert stated, "The positive actions of Senators Pryor and Boozman have capped three years of legislative advocacy to correct this oversight in the law. But each of these senators did so much more than that, battling on a number of key issues for the National Guard. For their tireless support, EANGUS is proud to award them the 2014 G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Eagle Award."

Senator Boozman worked to introduce or support the GI Tuition Fairness Act of 2013; the Servicemembers' Choice in Transition Act of 2013; the Careers for Veterans Act; and fought to ensure that National Guardsmen, dual-status military technicians, and other key reserve component personnel were put back to work and paid during the government shutdown.

Senator Pryor worked to hold the U.S. Air Force accountable regarding their questionable justifications for eliminating National Guard flying missions; introduced legislation to improve the airport security screening process for disabled service members and veterans; and worked to correct the inequity in the budget agreement to ensure that military retirees receive their full retirement benefits.

The Militia Award for most valuable U.S. Senate staff contributions will be presented to Steve Robertson, Staff Director of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee. His award reflects three years of diligence and guidance to usher S-629 to passage and ensure all National Guard retirees are properly recognized as veterans.

The Eagle Awards and associated Militia Awards for congressional staff will be presented at the EANGUS Congressional Awards Reception on Monday, February 3, 2014 at the Phoenix Park Hotel, located at 520 North Capitol Street, NW, Washington D.C. 20001. The reception starts at 6PM with the awards presented at 7PM.

2014 EAGLE & MILITIA AWARDS FOR THE U.S. HOUSE

WASHINGTON D.C. (Jan. 17, 2014) - The Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) is pleased to announce that U.S. Representative Steven Palazzo (R-MS) has been selected to receive the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Eagle Award. The award is given to members of the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives who have contributed outstanding and exceptional service to the National Guard.

U.S. Representative Steven Palazzo is the only member of Congress concurrently serving as an enlisted member of the National Guard and has worked tirelessly to support his fellow National Guardsmen. In 2013, Representative Palazzo fought to protect dual-status military technicians furlough; worked to ensure that the National Guard Lakota helicopter program was not cut from the President's budget; held the Air Force accountable for their lack of foresight in a fiscally constrained environment when they attempted to arbitrarily move National Guard flying missions without considering the costs associated with the move; and introduced bipartisan legislation to expand the National Guard's cyber capabilities.

EANUGS President John Helbert stated, "Congressman Palazzo's support for the National Guard is second to none. I am pleased to acknowledge Representative Palazzo's hard work on behalf of members of the National Guard by awarding her the 2014 G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Eagle Award. It is even more significant, since Sonny Montgomery served as both Adjutant General and U.S. Senator for the great state of Mississippi."

The Militia Award for most valuable U.S. House staff contributions will be presented to Chad Sydnor, Military Legislative Assistant U.S. Representative Joe Wilson (R-SC). Chad's tireless efforts in coordinating responses on the Capitol Hill ensured the National Guard was properly represented during any force structure recommendations.

Some programs that may be recommended for elimination or reduced when the Military Compensation and Retirement Modernization Commission makes their recommendations: change the 20-year military retirement plan to resemble civilian plans; means-testing TRICARE fees and establishing TRICARE For Life/TRICARE Standard enrollment fees; increase pharmaceutical fees for military families and retirees; eliminate presumptive service-connected conditions for disabled and ill veterans; end government subsidies to military commissaries; eliminate DOD tuition assistance programs for service members, and lower or freeze military pay.
